

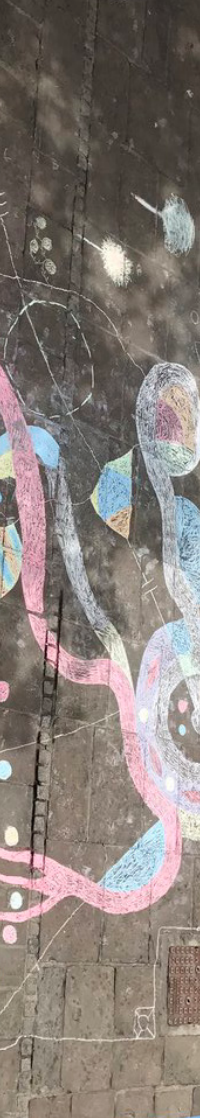

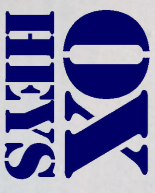

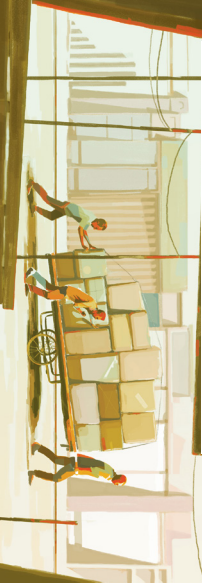


Timperspectiveart
